The second Envisioning Forum was held on August 3, 2010, in the SJC Community Center. The evening began with a blessing by Fr. Vincent. We then had a brief background of the Envisioning Project, which sprang from the Communications Ministry's desire to increase participation in the SJC Parish community. In October, 2009, the Communications Ministry administered a survey at all the Masses, asking parishioners about their ideas and feelings about their SJC Parish life in the areas of

- ✚ Worship & Liturgy
- ✚ Christian Community
- ✚ Outreach – Social Justice – Interfaith
- ✚ Demographic information
- ✚ Ideas about the most important things SJC should be doing now and in 3 years

The majority of those answering the survey thought SJC Parish was doing a pretty good job and they had a lot of good ideas about what could be even better.

Copies of the survey results were distributed to the participants and are available on the SJC website.

Based on the major themes we saw in the survey:

- ✚ Spiritual fulfillment & support
- ✚ More involvement & activities for youth & young adults
- ✚ Outreach & programs to get more people involved & served,

Fr. Greg and the Communications Ministry, with the support of the Parish Council, have begun a series of brainstorming and planning meetings for all those in the SJC Parish Community. These "Envisioning Forums" are intended to identify what we can do to make our Parish more effective and have more involvement by more Parishioners.

Appreciative Inquiry Journey to the Future

We then started the journey to the future using Appreciative Inquiry, a collaborative search for the best in people, their organizations, and the world around them.

Our journey to the SJC future has four stages:

- **Discover – appreciate the best of what is**
- **Dream what might be – the vision**
- **Design – co-construct the ideal**
- **Create a Destiny** based on what will be - participate in the creation of the design for the future – the plan for accomplishing the future – next meetings

Participants answered the four questions below, a brief discussion of the responses followed.

1. Describe a high point experience at SJC when you have been the most alive and engaged.
2. What did you value most (appreciate, find most important) about yourself in that situation? What did you value most about others? About SJC Parish?
3. What are the core/key factors that give life to SJC, without which it would not be the same?
4. Given your experience, if you had three wishes to enhance the health and vitality and community of SJC, what would they be? Write the 3 wishes on the cards using the markers.

The 3 wishes from each participant were sorted and grouped into categories with the result below, showing the collaborative image for the beginning of the plan for the SJC future. The categories were given titles that described their focus.
